COVID-19 Data – National & Local

- Surrey's <u>COVID-19Intelligence Summary Report</u>, next report is due on the 6th of December.
- <u>National data</u> on cases, vaccine, deaths is updated weekly, also available in easy-read version.
- Public Health England Campaign Resource Centre
- In England, 19,386 people tested positive up to 19 November 2022, a decrease of 6.17% from the previous 7 days.
- In Surrey, 393 people tested positive up to 19 November 2022, a decrease of 6% from previous 7 days.
- In Surrey up to 23 November, 965,033 people aged 12+ have received the 1st dose of the COVID-19vaccine, and 932,182 of people have received the 2nd dose. 777,057 people aged 12+ have received a booster or 3rd dose of vaccination. 329,322 (60.4%) people aged 50+ have received an autumn booster.
- COVID-19 hospital admissions have increased in the South East by 14% in the 7 days up to 21 November 2022.

Key Message: This winter it's essential you get vaccinated against both flu and COVID-19 to protect yourself and others, specially in preparation to the holiday season.

Book online or manage a free NHS flu vaccination at a pharmacy

Flu vaccination is safe and effective. It's offered every year through the NHS to help protect people at risk of getting seriously ill from flu.

You can <u>book online</u> a free NHS flu vaccine if you:

- are 50 and over (including those who will be 50 by 31 March 2023)
- have a serious long-term health condition
- are pregnant
- are in long-stay residential care
- receive a carer's allowance, or are the main carer for an older or disabled person who may be at risk if you get sick
- live with someone who is more likely to get a severe infection (such as someone who has HIV, has had a transplant, or is having certain treatments for cancer, lupus or rheumatoid arthritis)
- are a frontline health or social care worker (if you cannot get a flu vaccine through your employer)
